

THE TEAM OF INSTRUCTORS

Ana Bojinović Fenko is Professor of International Relations at the University of Ljubljana, and Senior Researcher at the Centre of International Relations in Ljubljana. She has been teaching for 15 years in Ljubljana and abroad mainly to international groups of students in the field of IR and European Studies. Her courses include Foreign Policy Analysis, the European Union External Action, World Politics and International Regionalism at all levels of university studies.

Danijel Crnčec is an Assistant Professor at the University of Ljubljana. He is working also for the Ministry of Infrastructure, covering strategic energy planning. His academic research and work has focused on international and EU climate and energy policies, climate diplomacy, and EU-Russia energy relations in the context of the development of international law of climate change. He has also been dealing with the eco-innovation and circular change in Slovenia.

Gian Luca Gardini is full professor of History of International Relations at the University of Udine and visiting professor of International Relations at Friedrich-Alexander University, Erlangen-Nürnberg. His research interests include foreign policy analysis, comparative regional integration and issues of power, order and institutions in world politics. He was also a practitioner of EU affairs in Brussels and regularly collaborates with governments and international organizations.

Laura Kirste is a research and teaching associate at the Department of International Management at Friedrich-Alexander University Erlangen-Nürnberg. Her research interests lie in the role of institutions for international business ethics. Her teaching portfolio comprises courses in the area of international management with a focus on experiential and interactive methods.

Beatriz Larrain Martinez is a professor at the School of Law at the University of Concepción in Chile where she is a member of the European Studies programme and she teaches Philosophy of Law and Sociology of Law. She holds a PhD in Law, Politics and Society from Northeastern University in Boston, Massachusetts. Her area of interest and research is the judicialisation of politics and judicial activism in Chile and the world.

Donata Levi is Professor of History of Art Criticism and Museum Studies at the University of Udine. She is responsible for the Photo Archive and for the LIDA (Computing Laboratory for art historical documents) of the Department of Humanities and Cultural Heritage. She is member of CIHA (Comité international d'Histoire de l'Art), of the "Consiglio Superiore dei Beni culturali" and of the Advisory Board of Gallerie degli Uffizi in Florence.

Fabio Miani is Associate Professor of Metallurgy at the University of Udine. He regularly collaborates with major steel companies and with top universities such as Cambridge in the UK and MIT in the US. He has designed the initiative SteelXFuture, which brings together students, academics and entrepreneurs from all over the world to design sustainability initiatives in the field of steel and metals. He has published extensively and he has registered several industrial patents.

Daniele Morandi is full professor of Archaeology and Art History of the Ancient Near East at the University of Udine. His research interests include the study of human settlement and the interaction between man, environment, resources and subsistence strategies, and the organization of complex societies between the Chalcolithic and the Iron Age mainly in Syria, Iraq and eastern Anatolia. He received the 2020 "Khaled al-Asaad" International Archaeological Award.

Jure Požgan is an Assistant Professor at the Chair of International Relations, Faculty of Social Sciences, University of Ljubljana. He also is a Researcher at the Centre of International Relations in Ljubljana. He has been teaching undergraduate courses in the field of International Relations and European Studies, including

Basics of the EU, the EU's External Action, Common Foreign and Security Policy of the EU and International Relations Theories.

Mario Robiony is an Associate Professor at the University of Udine, where he teaches Economic History and History of Finance. He obtained his PhD in Economic History from the University of Verona. His research interests are mainly oriented to the study of economic history in the contemporary age, with special attention to business and financial history. In 2016 he was visiting professor at the International Business School of Jönköping University in Sweden.
