The mystery of the 'sphero-conical vessel': experimental archaeology to contemporary making

The so-called 'sphero-conical vessel' is one of the most enigmatic objects in Islamic art. They are found on archaeological sites across the Middle East and in museum collections around the globe. They are difficult to date, and many theories circulate about their function and contents, from their use as grenades in military operations, to containers for fermented drinks. Several scholars are currently revisiting these questions from a variety of perspectives, and these mysterious objects also appeal to contemporary artists, including Iranian ceramic artist Shahpour Pouyan, current Middle East Ceramics Fellow at the V&A.
